I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 1. The Government of Cambodia has undertaken the Climate-Friendly Agribusiness Value Chains Sector Project (CFAVC) (the Project) with financing from the Asian Development Bank (ADB). The Project focuses on improving the competitiveness of the country's agricultural value chain covering four provinces of Cambodia that comprise Kampong Cham, Tboung Khmum, Takeo and Kampot. The outcome of the Project is productive and resource efficient agribusiness value chains developed in the project areas. The project's impact is enhanced productivity, climate resilience, quality and safety, value addition and rural household incoMEW. The Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) of the Government, in coordination with Ministry of Water Resources and Meteorology (MOWRAM) and Ministry of Rural Development (MRD), are implementing the Project.
- 2. Under the MAFF, this DDR covering two types of subprojects (Provincial Agricultural Development Center (PADC), and Equipment and Construction of Mechanization Engineering Workshops, MEW) consisting of 6 buildings located in 4 provinces as followings: i) One PADC in Takeo, province, ii) One PADC and one MEW in Tboung Khmum province, iii) One PADC and one MEW in Kampong Cham province and iv) One MEW in Kampot province, Table 1 shows the list of subprojects by province.
- 3. These 6 subprojects in the four provinces will be used to improve and create resources and training centers for service provision, agribusinesses and farmer value chain linkages as well as the technical assistance will be provided to manage the training facility and undertake a needs assessment to ensure good training unit management and appropriate procurement. This is to improve the formal training facilities for provincial training and capacity building of CSA, Sustainable Rice Platform (SRP) and Cambodia Good Agricultural Practice (CAMGAP) standards, as well as agricultural cooperatives and FWUC accountancy, bookkeeping and business planning, together with the theory of agricultural machinery and equipment repair, operation and maintenance. Training and classroom equipment will also be provided.
- 4. All proposed structures of the 6 subprojects' locations will be constructed on public state land available within the compound of the Provincial Department of Agricultures in the four targeted provinces as stated in the subproject selection criteria of the PAM. The actual size of land to be acquired for the construction of the two types of buildings is generally less than 20m by 20m on the vacant land within land boundary occupied by PDAFFs. Due Diligence Exercises confirmed no IR and IP impacts to all subproject locations and IRC-GDR was also consulted. Therefore, MAFF subprojects covering the construction of PADCs and MEWs within the four provinces are classified as category C for both IR and IP.
- 5. This Due Diligence Report (DDR) has been prepared based on actual site visit, consultation with local authorities and relevant authorities such as representatives of the project management unit (PMU) from MAFF, representatives from Provincial Project Implementation Unit (PPIU) of PDAFF and the consultant teams of CS1 and CS2. Once the report is getting cleared from the MAFF/PMU and the ADB, it

will be posted in the accessible public places in Khmer language and will be uploaded on the ADB (English version) and MAFF's websites.

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

A. Project Background

- 6. The Climate-Friendly Agribusiness Value Chains Sector Project (CFAVC) will support the implementation of the government's Agriculture Sector Strategic Development Plan, 2014–2018 and the Industrial Development Policy, 2015–2025 aimed at improving the competitiveness of agricultural value chains in Kampong Cham and Tboung Khmum provinces along the GMS southern economic corridor, and Kampot and Takeo provinces along the south-coastal economic corridor. The CFAVC project has 3 outputs as following:
- 7. Output 1: Critical agribusiness value chain infrastructure improved and made climate resilient. It involves rehabilitation and modernization of rural infrastructure to increase production and resource efficiency, reduce postharvest losses, and enhance quality and value chain links while reducing green-house gas emissions and increasing climate resilience. The activities under this outputs are described as followings:
 - 7.1 Rehabilitation water management infrastructures (off-farm irrigation systems, on-farm rainwater harvesting ponds, drip irrigation) to climate resilient condition:
 - 7.2 Upgrading agricultural cooperative value chain infrastructure (drying, processing and storage facilities);
 - 7.3 Improving connectivity to cooperatives and markets through climate resilient farm road networks;
 - 7.4 (Strengthening the infrastructure for agricultural quality and safety testing at the National Agricultural Laboratory; and
 - 7.5 Promoting renewable energy (biodigesters and use of solar energy in target cooperative areas) for value chain improvement.
- 8. **Output 2: Climate-smart agriculture and agribusiness promoted.** The project will support the Cambodian Agricultural Research and Development Institute to produce, multiply, and distribute climate-resilient varieties of rice and maize and to improve weaning and acclimatization of mango and cassava; and the activities under this output are as following:
 - 8.1 Deploying climate resilient varieties;
 - 8.2 Strengthening the capacity for climate friendly production practices and technologies; and
 - 8.3 Promoting farm mechanization and extension.
- 9. **Output 3: Enabling environment for climate-friendly agribusiness enhanced.** The project will support the MAFF and the Ministry of Commerce in creating a favorable policy environment for agribusiness to mobilize the private sector participation through public-private partnerships (PPPs) and contract farming. The activities under these output are as followings:
 - 9.1 Formulating climate-friendly agribusiness policies and standards;
 - 9.2 Promoting green finance and risk-sharing mechanisms; and
 - 9.3 Supporting climate risk management through information and communication technologies

B. CFAVC Project Supports

- 10. Different kinds of subprojects are under supports by the CFAVC under the three ministries and among those are as following:
 - 10.1 Rehabilitation, modernization and made climate resilient of 27 irrigation systems targeting command area of 15,000 ha;
 - 10.2 Commissioning of 800 on-farm rainwater harvesting ponds;
 - 10.3 Establishment of 15 drip irrigation demonstration units;
 - 10.4 Installation of at least 12,000 bio-digesters and 6000 compost huts in target agricultural cooperative areas;
 - 10.5 Provision of support to 80 agricultural cooperatives with integrated adaptation measures in post-harvest infrastructure investments;
 - 10.6 Upgrading of Crop Product Quality and Safety Testing infrastructure in National Agricultural Laboratory;
 - 10.7 Upgrading to climate standards for at least 250 km farm road networks to improve connectivity of farms to cooperatives and markets,
 - 10.8 New construction of three Provincial Agricultural Development Centers (PADCs) and one rehabilitation,

New construction of four provincial engineering workshops made fully operational to provide agribusiness services and strengthen farmer value chain linkages.

C. Impact and Outcome

11. The Project is aligned with the impact on improvement of agricultural competitiveness and the impact is reflected in enhancement of productivity, climate resilience, quality and safety, value addition and rural household incoMEW. The Project will have the following outcome: productive and resource efficient agribusiness value chains developed in the Project areas.

D. Subprojects Description

12. Under this DDR, the Project will support for the construction of PADCs for Takeo, Tbong Khmum, and Kampong Cham. And the MEWs will be provided to Tboung Khmum, Kampong Cham, and Kampot. Below Table 1 presented number of construction components to be provided in each respective four targeted provinces.

13. The Training Building for *PADC*, which will be supported by the project, are located in 3 provinces Takeo, Tboung Khmum and Kampong Cham. And the Mechanization Engineering Workshops, which will be supported by the

project will be located in the provinces of Kampot, Kampong Cham and Tboung Khmum. The two subproject types (total 6 subprojects) will not involve in IR and IP, as they are located within the compound of the PDAs, which are state lands as stated in the PAM under the subproject selection criteria and confirmed by this DDR. Annex 1 provided with the confirmation on land availability from the PDAs in the four provinces.

14. The design dimensions of (The Training Building for PADC and the Engineering workshop) buildings are as shown in the below Table 2

- 15. The design of the buildings is equipped with the following equipment/accessories and sub infrastructures:
 - 15.1 Fire Safety: fire exits, locations of fire extinguishers
 - 15.2 Electrical installations, using power sources from both the grid electricity and solar energy. For solar energy installation, the solar panels are to be installed on roof of the building and will not acquire any extra land,
 - 15.3 Sewerage system, drainage system, the systems will not acquire extra land as the drainage pipes are run parallel and on the outside edge of the building and connecting the existing drainage system,
 - 15.4 The comfort rooms are to be constructed within the building compound using septic tank. It will not acquire any extra land for its construction.
 - 15.5 The provincial Agricultural Development Centers will be provided with training and class room equipment.
 - 15.6 The Provincial Engineering workshop will be provided with following equipment as shown in the below Table 3. And the equipment is to be located within the building compound and will not acquire any extra land.

- 16. Main structural elements of the buildings are from reinforced concrete foundations, columns, and beams. The wall of the building is constructed from brick with cement mortar plastering and the roof of the building is from steel frame covering with tiles. The building is design to supply with air vents for internal air circulation. The drainage system is using blind stone drainage channel running surrounding the building and connecting to the existing drainage system. Figure 1, 2, 3 and 4 present the Designed Drawings of both the Training Building and Mechanization Engineering Workshop.
- 17. Site locations information for each subproject is presented in Table 4 and the location map of each subproject is presented in Figure 5 to Figure 8.
- 18. During the impact assessment carried out as part of screening process with supporting from site engineers of CS1/PIC as well as; the CFAVC work teams (CS2/CS1 with representatives from MAFF-PMU, PDA-PPIU and local authorities) visited to the proposed location/sites of all subprojects. And the findings from the visits are shown that there is no any private involuntary resettlement impact as well as no Indigenous People impact for the proposed subprojects. Training Building and Mechanization Engineering Workshops will be constructed inside the compound of each PDA and with the confirmation certificates provided on land availability shown in Annex 1 (land tenure status).

III. SCOPE OF LAND ACQUISITION AND INVOLUNTARY RESETTLEMENT, INDIGENOUS PEOPLES IMPACTS

19.

The construction works to six locations of four provinces which covering by this DDR are limited on the existing land available at the land compound of PDA and no IP residing within and nearby the locations. Therefore, these 6 subprojects are not involved with IR and IP impacts. The land acquisition related fieldwork for the subprojects conducted in April 2020 aims at using available land in the existing compound of PDA. During the impact assessment screening process, the CFAVC joint working teams, consisting of CS2 and CS1 with representatives from MAFF-PMU, PDA-PPIU and local authorities visited to all subproject sites and conducted stakeholder consultations meetings with all relevant project focal points from each province. The findings are concluded that the subproject design will not have any impact on private / community assets. Annex 1 does present the confirmed certificates on land tenure with UTM (X and Y) location. The land availability confirmation as shown in Annex 1 are belonged to the PDA/the state land, thus there is no any impact on both IR and IP. Annex 4 shows the LARP screening Checklist for IR and IP

IV. DUE DILIGENCE

A. Background and Methodology

20. The impact assessment of the MAFF subprojects as listed in Table 1 were conducted with participation from the CS Teams, consisting of CS2, CS1 and from MAFF-PMU / PDA-PPIU of the 4-provinces. The team suggested to the 4 PPIU to provide the land availability confirmation to proof that no private land is acquired. The land availability confirmation shown in Annex 1.

B. Finding of Due Diligence

21. It has been confirmed in the field that the subprojects does not trigger ADB's IR and IP safeguards. The Project is aligned with the improvement of the agricultural competitiveness with the impact reflecting in enhanced productivity, climate resilience, quality and safety testing, value addition and rural household incoMEW. The Project will have the outcome on productive and resource efficient agribusiness value chains to be developed in the Project areas. Table 4 presents more detailed information of each subproject.

22. The construction works to six locations of four provinces which covering by this DDR are limited on the existing land available at the land compound of PDA and no IP residing within and nearby the locations. Therefore, these 6 subprojects are not involved with IR and IP impacts. The land acquisition related fieldwork for the

V. INFORMATION DISCLOSURE, CONSULTATION AND PARTICIPATION

A. Information Disclosure Activities Accomplished

- 24. The Updated PIB, Annex 2 and GRM, Annex 3 are the two main source documents to provide information disclosure for each subproject to public and relevant authorities. They do present the involvement of relevant project focal points and as well as the local authorities.
- 25. Once this DDR is approved, it will subsequently be disclosed on ADB and on CFAVC websites. Summary of the DDR in Khmer will be available at the commune offices and at the villages. .

B. Subprojects Disclosure and Consultation

- 26. During subproject assessment, the meeting with the PPIU representatives was organized on 21 April 2020 to discuss on social safeguards policy and on the subproject selection criteria. During the preparation of this DDR, the consultation carried out field assessment to validate the availability of selected land area in the four provinces. And the discussions in the meetings were focused on (i) providing information about the design and construction works on the training building, (ii) mechanization engineering workshop, (iii) and the use of land after construction completion of each subproject.
- 27. Grievance Redress Mechanism as shown in Annex 3 was presented during the meeting. The participants, which were presented in the meeting were explained on the grievance redress mechanism (GRM) processes and procedures. The cut-off date of 21 April 2020, updated PIB and GRM structure and steps in grievance handling, the lodging and recording of complaints and their timely resolutions including the discloser of information resulting from any changes during DDR implementation was explained in detail to all the PPIU members. The updated PIB (Annex 2) and GRM (Annex 3) brochures were distributed to all 4 provinces, during each meeting. The entitlements in the updated PIB have been disclosed to all PDAs. However, full entitlements to the all PPIU members were disclosed in Khmer during the consultation.

C. . Grievance Redress Mechanism

28. During online meeting with the PPIU of the four provinces and the PMU, It was advised that for the six subprojects, there is no need to establish the Commune GRM focal point. And the reason of doing so, because there is no land acquired to contribute from private owner, the buildings are located

inside the existing compound of the PDA, which is State Land. However, the CS1 social safeguards specialist had explained that for commune local GRC is a quick process in establishment, and the expert will explain the full process to local commune GRC on how to proceed on GRC for both environmental and social, and exactly for the higher level of GRC was already established since 09 December 2020 the Executive agency (EA) MAFF-PMU issued letter to both MOWRAM and MRD PMUs requesting for establishment of GRM focal points to have joined members from three ministries (MAFF, MOWRAM and MRD). Annex 3 shows the nominated letter on GRM establishment covering 4 target provinces.

- 29. The objective of GRM is to resolve complaints as quickly as possible at the local level through a process of conciliation. It provides clear and transparent procedures for registering complaints and their resolution processes.
- 30. A well-defined grievance redress and resolution mechanism has already been established for four target provinces (Kampot, Takeo, Kampong Cham and Tboung Khmum) to resolve each member grievances and complaints in a timely and satisfactory manner. All focal members have been made fully aware of their rights, and the detailed grievance redress procedures are being publicized through an effective public consultation meeting in each location. The Local Commune GRM was suggested by each PPIU not to establish due to all structures will be built on the state land (PDA compound).

VI. INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS

A. Overall Arrangement

31. The Project will be implemented by MAFF through the Project Management Unit (PMU), And during construction works of the subprojects the PPIUs in the four provinces will work in coordination with the consultant team consisting of the Social Safeguard and Environmental Specialists and the provincial engineers based in the four provinces will ensure that the construction works are to follow safeguard measures as specified in the DDR and the EMP.

B. Cadastral Administration Office

32. The Cadastral Administration Office (CAO) under the Ministry of Land Management, Urban Planning and Construction is responsible for issuing titling documents, including the certificate of land use rights, hard titles and social land concession as part of securing tenure for landless and issuing title documents for the land plots.

C. Linkage to the Award of Civil Works Contract with DDR

33. The civil works contracts for all subprojects as addressed in this DDR shall be awarded only after the following conditions are met:

These requirements will pave the way for ADB to issue its "No Objection" to MAFF for the award of civil works contract to the civil works contractor. MAFF and PDA will ensure that no involuntary resettlement impact with the construction activities.

VII. MONITORING AND REPORTING

34. Implementation of the DDR will require an internal monitoring with support from PIC consultants, but the MAFF subprojects as addressed in this master DDR doesn't involve/have any involuntary resettlement impact

- 35. All internal monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the DDR will be carried out by the MAFF assigned social safeguards officer and TA PIC consultant in accordance with the principles agreed in this DDR. The objective of internal monitoring is to:
- 36. Measure and report on the progress in the preparation and implementation of the DDR; identify problems and risks, if any and the measures to mitigate them; and Internal monitoring with results will be reported to GRM as establish in 4 targeted provinces from commune level to provincial level and court, The status of implementation of the DDR will be incorporated in the quarterly progress report of the Project by PMU for submission to ADB.
- 37. Indicators subject to integrated internal monitoring are those related to process and immediate outputs and results, as follows:
 - i. Information campaign and consultations with stakeholders;
 - ii. Grievance redress, among others. Relevant indicators have been developed for implementation.

B. Project Management and Implementation Support Consultants

38. Project implementation consultants (PIC) (package: CS1) was already mobilized to support MEF, MAFF, MOWRAM, MRD, and the PMU and PPIUs.

C. External Monitoring Agency or Third Party

39. As clearly mentioned in the LARF and PAM for MAFF subprojects selection criteria, it doesn't have any involuntary resettlement impact and some subprojects as workshop building will be constructed in the PDA of each province (government land), thus this MAFF subprojects master DDR will not necessarily require the third party to validate as well as no voluntary donation has been made to this DDR (only the public land is acquired).

D. Pre-Construction Impacts and Mitigation

- 40. There will be no land acquisition required for the development of the requisite project component facilities. The facilities will be constructed on state land within the existing compound of the Provincial Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (PDAFFs).
- 41. The location of the proposed sub-projects and its components will have no impact on any declared protected, conservation or bio-diversity areas. All of the proposed development works will not have any impact on historical cultural or archeological sites or temples.

VIII. CONCLUSION

- 42. This DDR covering two types of subprojects (Provincial Agricultural Development Center (PADC), and Equipment and Construction of Mechanization Engineering Workshops, MEW) consisting of 6 buildings located in 4 provinces as followings: i) One PADC in Takeo, province, ii) One PADC and one MEW in Tboung Khmum province, iii) One PADC and one MEW in Kampong Cham province and iv) One MEW in Kampot province. Base on screening and consultation carried out, all subproject's location under this DDR will not involve in IR and IP impacts, following LARF process and procedures.
- 43. The IR and IP screening assessment has been carried out with representatives from MAFF-PMU, PPIU of the four provinces, support from CS2 (Capacity Building and Climate Smart Agriculture Consulting Firm) to see the location and site for the proposed construction of all structures.
- 44. All proposed structures of the 6 subprojects' locations will be constructed on public state land available within the compound of the Provincial Department of Agricultures in the four targeted provinces as stated in the subproject selection criteria of the PAM. The available size of land for each subproject is as followed; 1) Mechanization Engineering Workshop in Kampot 60m X 75m, 2) 20m X 20 for Takeo, 3) 50m X 100m for Kampong Cham and 4) 32,700m2 is for Tboung Khmum. and all proposed civil work is requiring land size less than 20m x 20m (Training Building requires 15.85m X 18.85m and Mechanization Engineering Workshop requires 15.85m X 15.85m) of land per DED.
- 45. In case of any complaint arise, the existing commune GRC is in place (the local GRC), and they will serve as GRC functions for both environmental and social, and the higher level of GRC had been established under this project since 09 December 2020 base on the letter issued by Executive agency (EA), MAFF-PMU to both MOWRAM and MRD PMUs.
- 46. The MAFF PMU has issued a letter on 09 December 2020 for national GRM focal points establishment jointly with other two ministries (MOWRAM and MRD) included with 4 provinces PPIUs in subject to cover both environmental and social safeguards for all Category C subprojects for the whole CFAVC.
- 47. PMU/PIUs will be responsible to monitor on sub-project implementation and reporting its progress in to QPR and ESMR with support from PIC's specialists.




Figure 2: Floor Plan - Proposed Training Building PADCs




Figure 3: Perspective View Rear - Proposed Mechanization Engineering Workshop




Figure 4: Floor Plan - PADC Training Building




Figure 5: Location Map of Proposed Sub-Projects .Kampot Province




Figure 6: Location Map of Proposed Sub-Projects. Takeo Province




Figure 7: Location Map of Proposed Sub-Projects, Kampong Cham Province





Figure 8: Location Map of Proposed Sub-Projects, Tboung Khmum Province

Climate-Friendly Agribusiness Value Chain Sector Project (CFAVC)

The purpose of this PIB is to provide CFVAC related information to persons and households at the CFVAC subproject sites, who may be physically (relocation, loss of residential land or loss of shelter) or economically (loss of land, assets, access to assets, income sources or means of livelihood) affected by land acquisition and involuntary resettlement.

Project Background - What is CFVAC Project?

The Royal Government of Cambodia has undertaken the Climate-Friendly Agribusiness Value Chain Sector Project (CFAVC), with financial assistance from the Asian Development Bank (ADB). The CFAVC aimed at improving the competitiveness of agricultural value chains in Kampong Cham and Tboung Khmum provinces along the Greater Mekong Sub-region (GMS) southern economic corridor, Kampot and Takeo provinces along the south-coastal economic corridor, shaded yellow).



Target provinces (yellow)

The CFAVC will boost the climate resilience of critical agricultural infrastructure and help commercialize rice, maize, cassava, and mango production. It will help increasing crop productivity and diversification; improve the capacity for storage, processing, and quality and safety testing; and promote the use of solar and bioenergy. It will strengthen the technical and institutional capacity for climate-smart agriculture and create an enabling policy environment for climate-friendly agribusinesses. 

Provincial Agricultural Development Center


The project supports for the new construction of three Provincial Agricultural Development Center (PADC), they are located within the compound of the PDAFF, see figure 6. In addition it supports for one renovation within the compound of the Kampot PDAFF. The design dimension of the PADC is of length 18.85m, width 15.85m and height 6.766m,

What are size of the facilities for MAFF Subprojects?

The capacity of Paddy warehouse with paddy dryer (100 tons) the CFAVC project will need the size of lands at least 30 m X 40 m. (12 paddy warehouses and 12 paddy dryers).

The capacity of Rice Seed warehouse without rice seed dryer (50 tons) the CFAVC project will need the size of lands at least 18 m X 20 m. (3 Rice Seed warehouses).

The capacity of Cassava warehouse without dryer (200 tons) the CFAVC project will need the size of lands at least 25 m X 35 m. (2 Cassava warehouses).

There are only 20 crop warehouses and only 12 paddy dryers that covered 4 target provinces (KPC, TBK, KP and TK).

Based on the selection criteria for these subprojects will not cause any impacts to private asset, but it needs the contract agreement between the AC land owners and PDA-PPIU as addressed in the selection criteria under paragraph 17.

During the impact assessment screening process; the CFAVC work teams (CS2/CS1 with representatives from MAFF-PMU, PDA-PPIU and local authorities) visited to the proposed location/areas of all subprojects and the finding is that there is no any involuntary resettlement and land acquisition impact on private assets, the sample confirmed certification is in Annex 1 (land ownership status).

What is the scope of land acquisition and resettlement and the likely impacts under MAFF Subprojects?

There will be no any impacts on private owned land/assets for all MAFF subprojects due to the following applied selection criteria were:

- Cassava drying and storage facility and a mango drip irrigation scheme. Implementation arrangements for the cassava drying facility are through an agricultural cooperative that will purchase its own land if needed under a private commercial transaction with a willing seller independent of the CFAVCP and using the cooperatives own resources. Subproject selection criteria preclude any involuntary land acquisition for this type of subproject.
- With regards to drip irrigation infrast holder will receive drip irrigation infrast his/her own land in exchange for allow be tested and act as a working example purposes. Annex 3: Grievance Redress Committee (GRM)

The Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) was established with joined members from three ministries (MOWRAM, MAFF and MRD) to promptly address the concerns, complaints, and grievances about the Project on both social and environmental performances at no costs to the complainant and without fear of retribution. The GRC, which was established before commencement of site works is chaired by each EA and IA to be assisted by each individual SEO. The GRC is included members from each implementing institution (from PDRD, PDA and PDOWRAM of the 4 provinces). Grievances can be filed in writing or verbally with any member of the GRC. The committee will have 15 days to respond with a resolution. If unsatisfied with the decision, the existence of the GRC shall not impede the complainant's access to the Government's judicial or administrative remedies.

Each PMU, through the each PPIU, shall make public the existence of this grievance redress mechanism through public awareness campaigns. Each PMU shall also set-up a hotline for complaints and the hotline shall be publicized through the media and numbers placed on the notice boards outside the construction site and at local government offices (e.g., provincial, district, commune levels). Locally affected people will still be able to express grievances through the commune councils and these would be referred to PMU through the usual channels in those committees.

The GRC, through the SEO, will receive, follow-up and prepare monthly reports regarding all complaints, disputes or questions received about the Project and corresponding actions taken to resolve the issues. The SEO will develop and maintain a database of complaints received related to the Project. The GRC will also use the punitive clauses of the 1996 Law on Environmental Protection and Natural Resources Management in conjunction with MOE to prosecute any offending parties.

The contractor will be encouraged to establish discussions with the village representatives before works commence and maintain these discussions as an ongoing activity through the life of the project.

When can we use the Grievance Redress Mechanism?

▶ You can submit a grievance at any time if you believe you have been affected by construction or related activities of the CFAVC.

Where can we submit a grievance?

- ► You can submit your grievance orally or in writing to the Commune Council. If necessary you can request support from friends or a NGO, when submitting or writing your complaint (at any stage).
- ▶ The Grievance Redress Mechanism has three stages to resolve complaint with regards to CFAVC. These stages are: Commune level, District level, and Provincial level (Grievance Redress Committee).
